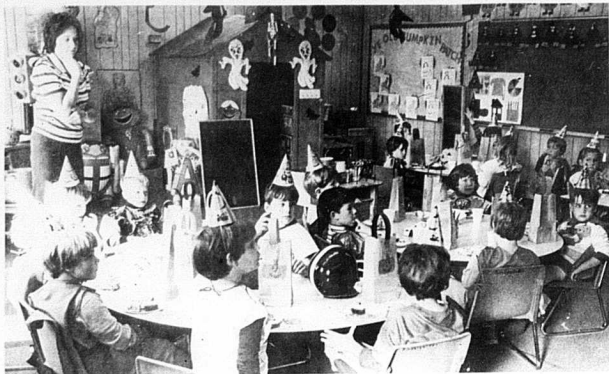
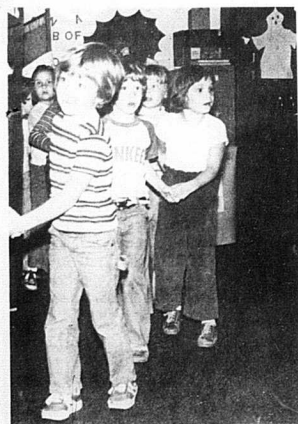


# Ghouls, ghosts and goblins

## Army seeks to review discharges

The Department of Defense has re-emphasized that the deadline for discharge review application expires on Jan. 1, 1980 for those veterans separated before 1965 with an Undesirable Discharge (now called "Discharge Under Other Than Honorable Conditions"). This extended period for filing in an exception to the regular 18-month statute of limitations prescribed by Title 38, Section 1552, United States Code. In order to be considered for upgrading, the application for discharge review must be postmarked by Jan. 1, 1980.

Interested veterans can obtain applications for discharge review (DD Form 203) from any of the following agencies:

- Veterans Administration, American Red Cross, and Veterans Organizations (e.g., American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Jewish War Veterans of the USA, Veterans of Foreign Wars, etc.).
- State Departments or Offices of Veterans Affairs (listed in local phone directories).
- Military installations.

Review can be initiated by submission of a DD Form 203, "Application for Review of Discharge or Dismissal from the Armed Forces of the United States," which is available through any of the organizations listed above or by writing directly to the Discharge Review Board of the services.

While every effort is being made by the Service Discharge Review Boards to expedite the processing and hearing of current applications, the current workload for the boards is such that an ex-Army applicant may be required to wait as long as one year for hearing if he requests a personal appearance and lesser periods for Navy/Marine and Air Force boards. Average hearing time for a records review only is within a 90-day period following the receipt of applications by the Service board concerned.

In addition, an index of previous discharge review board decisions is available at certain Veterans Administration Regional Offices and at all offices of State Directors of Veterans Affairs. These indexes may be used to assist former members in preparation of their particular cases. If an applicant identifies cases on the index which appear to be helpful, copies of the pertinent documents may be obtained by writing to the Armed Forces Discharge Review/Correction Board Hearing Room, The Pentagon Complex, Washington, D.C. 20310.

Exact numbers of eligible veterans are not available. Earlier estimates placed the number of eligible persons between 750,000 to 1.5 million. To date, only 2,750 former servicemembers have applied for the upgrading. Of those who made the application, 1,206, or over 45 percent have received an upgrading.
