Shrout, Vaughn written in to city council

Brown swamps Nunn in countywide Democratic sweep

It was John V. Brown over Louis Nunn and Tommy Vaughn and Jimmy Shrout on a write-in vote for city council members that highlighted last Tuesday's general election.
