### Kay's Kitchen

Thanksgiving is near and likely the next big meal you will prepare. If you are an old hand at baking a turkey, you will not need this. However, I'm sure there are many who who refer to a recipe. Select a turkey in size suitable for your family. There is a chart for cooking the stuffed bird: 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 pounds, 45 to 55 minutes per pound; 3 to 4 pounds, 1 1/2 to 2 hours; 4 to 5 pounds, 2 to 2 1/2 hours; 6 to 7 pounds, 2 1/2 to 3 hours; 8 to 10 pounds, 3 to 3 1/2 hours; 12 to 14 pounds, 3 1/2 to 4 hours; 16 to 18 pounds, 4 to 4 1/2 hours; 20 to 24 pounds, 4 1/2 to 5 hours. Oven temperature, moderately hot, about 375 to 400 degrees.

This is for a foil wrapped turkey. Brush the turkey with melted fat, seal edges. Seal does not have to be perfect. Place the wrapped bird in open roasting pan and cook in preheated oven. If you do not use the foil wrapped method, cook turkey in open roaster at lower temperature, about 325 to 350 degrees and increase cooking time. Test for doneness by sticking a cooking fork into meaty part of leg. When done the fork will go in easily and tender.

For either method of cooking I always add the bird, breast down. During the last 45 minutes of cooking time, turn turkey breast side up and brown. Baste one or twice. If you know how to do it, remove foil and baste bird and halfway between center and outside edge of pie, comes out clean. Fooled.

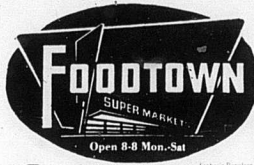
