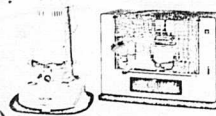

State jobless rate higher last month
Unemployment information released last week by the Department of Human Resources indicates the October unemployment rate was 5.7 percent, a 0.4 percentage point higher than the September rate. The national unemployment rate for October was 5.6 percent.
Unemployed Kentuckians numbered 26,000 in October, 6,000 more than during September, said Robert Macdonald, chief labor market analyst for the department. "The October increase was primarily due to job layoffs plus the large number of new and re-entering workers in the labor force," he said. Youth unemployment continues to be high throughout Kentucky, he added.
According to Macdonald, Kentucky's October labor force of 1,001,000 was the largest ever recorded. Macdonald credits this increased job opportunity within the state and more people seeking job because of inflation.
