DES grants received

The Nicholas County Fire and Rescue Squad and the Headquarters Volunteer Fire Department were recipients of two recent grants from the Kentucky Disaster and Emergency Services (KDES). The Headquarters fire squad received a truck on loan from the U.S. Army "Wheel" program. The truck was loaned to the Nicholas County Civil Defense which in turn loaned it to the department.

After four years ownership of the truck will revert to the Nicholas County Civil Defense unit, which expects to keep it in service in the Headquarters unit. Along with the truck came a DES grant which was used to convert it to fire department standards. The other DES grant was for more than \$3,500 and is to be used for a one-way communication system.
