A bid of \$487.85 from Duncan Electric was accepted for work on the Nicholas County Jail. The work will include installations of exit lights and smoke detectors and upgrading of other lights in the building.

The court also authorized the borrowing of \$15,000 from the First National Bank of Carlisle for deposit into the general expense fund. The note will be due on Dec. 31, 1979 at seven percent interest.

In other business the Johnson-Mathews Health Care, Inc. told the court it will pay \$20,000 as of Nov. 30 to be applied to the indebtedness on the hospital bond issue. The money will be applied to the Hospital Bond Sinking Fund.

Greyhound fumble, began the Jacket's on their way. It took awhile but with 51 seconds remaining Mike Sewell tossed the ball to Mike Hatton for a one-yard score. Sewell's kick proved good as time lapsed to end the game 23-7 with Paris winning.

"They played the best they ever played," said Coach Ben Pumpfery after the game. "We really laid it on the line and the score was still 23-7."
