Action coming on Paris by-pass

Nicholas County's representative in the Kentucky State Senate, Dr. Ed Ford of Cynthia, has been attempting to get the Kentucky Department of Highways to install traffic lights and safety devices on the Paris by-pass in order to reduce the number of accidents on that road.

The following is a series of correspondence which Sen. Ford has with the Highway Dept. concerning this matter and a listing of what steps have been or will be taken to remedy this situation.

I am not a civil engineer and will certainly accept D.O.T.'s solution to the problem. However, I would be remiss if I didn't state with the Department some of the reasons I believe justify my opinion as to present inadequacies at this intersection:

- 1. "Bumpers" on 400 are not rough enough.
2. "Bumpers" should be installed on the by-pass portion to attract attention.
3. All signals lights are too high above eyes level to dominate attention.
4. Should have signs warning of approaching danger such as, "Warning-Traffic Signal Ahead."
