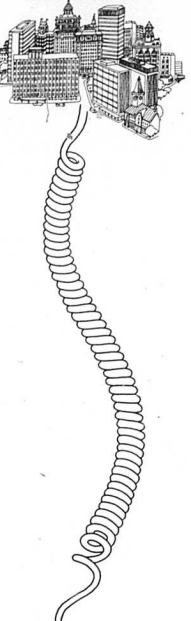

Commission Nominees Questioned by Legislators
The six people nominated for positions on the state's Energy Regulatory Commission and Utility Regulatory Commission submitted to questions from legislators recently in an unprecedented confirmation hearing.

Under a law passed by the 1978 General Assembly, the old Public Service Commission, which had regulatory authority over all the state's utilities, was split into a full-time Energy Regulatory Commission with authority over gas and electric rates and the part-time Utility Regulatory Commission with authority over water, sewer and telephone rates.

Several legislators said they supported the computerization effort because it would help eliminate some of the inequalities presently found in the tax assessment process.

In other action, the A & R Committee got a report on the state's debt which urged the state to proceed carefully in considering any new bond issues which would add to the indebtedness.

Several legislators said they were pleased with the investigation and both sides agreed that KHC will be better able to avoid future criticism if it has an improved understanding of the
