

If you are enjoying cool delicious salads this hot summer, you need good salad dressing to make them perfect. And if you want to save some money, make your own. You might like to try making salad dressings from scratch. Do keep in mind different salads need different dressings. Fats and nutmeats salads are given a lift by using a milder dressing, then add a little mayonnaise, homemade if possible. Here are several dressing recipes to make at home.

**COOKED SALAD DRESSING**  
2 whole eggs  
2 tablespoons flour  
1/4 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons butter  
1/4 cup water  
1 teaspoon dry mustard  
Combine salt (to taste)  
1 teaspoon dry mustard  
Combine dry ingredients and add eggs, butter, water and vinegar. Mix carefully. Cook over a heat, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens. For a more flat flavor may add more vinegar.

**HOMEMADE DRESSING**  
In a small mixing bowl, with a fork, beat together 1 egg yolk, 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1 teaspoon dry mustard. Beat in 1 teaspoon olive vinegar, a drop at a time, until 1/2 cup cream is whipped at a time. This is especially good with chicken salad.

**CHEAMY ITALIAN DRESSING**  
1/2 cup red wine vinegar  
1/2 cup vegetable oil  
1/2 cup onion, minced  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Combine dry ingredients in a bottle and leave in refrigerator at least two hours.

**CUCUMBER DRESSING**  
1 cup creamed cottage cheese  
1 large peeled cucumber, seeded and chunked (about a cup)

**TOMATO DRESSING**  
2 medium onions, chopped very fine  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon dry mustard  
1 teaspoon white pepper  
1 tablespoon paprika  
1 can tomato soup  
1/4 cup vinegar  
1 teaspoon horseradish  
Combine onion and sugar. Let stand 30 minutes. Blend together salt, dry mustard, pepper and paprika. Add tomato, onion, oil and horseradish. Blend mixture and horseradish. Best work. Let stand 1 hour to blend. Makes 1 cup.

**GREEN GODDRESS DRESSING**  
1/4 cup wine vinegar  
Pinch paprika  
1/4 cup unpeeled fresh parsley  
1 green onion, minced  
1 teaspoon onion, minced  
1/2 clove minced garlic or 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder  
1/2 cup vinegar  
Combine all ingredients in a small mixing bowl. Cover and refrigerate at least an hour.
