

Schools to start breakfast program

Effective September 1, 1980 the Nicholas County School System will offer a School Breakfast Program to students in kindergarten through grade twelve. This program will be held at Nicholas County Elementary School. The cost of breakfast will be 20 cents for elementary students and 30 cents for high school students. Those students who qualify for free and reduced price lunch will also qualify for free and reduced price breakfast with reduced price breakfast costing the student 10 cents.

The School Breakfast Program was authorized by the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-442) which was enacted October 11, 1966. This program was aimed at schools serving a large number of needy children or schools

serving children who traveled long distances daily to get to school. Legislation has since been enacted which made the School Breakfast Program available to all students and on October 1975 Public Law 94-16 made the School Breakfast Program a permanent part of School Food Service. Studies of School Breakfast Programs have indicated that students who eat breakfast are less fatigued, more alert, and more ready to learn. As of January 1980 86 percent of Kentucky's schools were participating in the School Breakfast Program.

In the spring of 1979 a questionnaire was sent to Kentucky schools concerning the School Breakfast Program. Comments regarding the success of the program were made by many administrators. One administrator noted that the breakfast program resulted in "fewer discipline problems, better attendance, and a better learning environment." Another administrator made the following comment on the far-reaching results of the breakfast program: "A healthier child would be a better student... and would eventually make a better student, and a better community."
