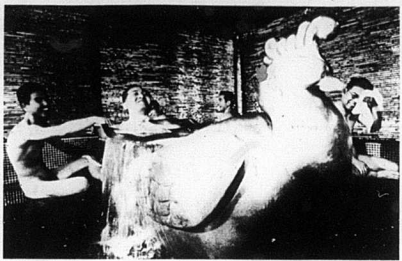
Down Memory Lane Nurses graduate, power saw stolen, 118 registered
