# Writer recalls the Old Stone House

(Editor's note: This article was first published in June of 1974 and is currently featured in the June, 1980 issue of the Kentucky Historical Society Bulletin. The writer, Harry D. Galbreath of Carlisle, is currently president of the Nicholas County Historical Society, Inc. Mr. Galbreath's widow, as expressed in the last paragraph of the article, has been deceased. The Old Stone House was purchased after this article was written by Thomas Strohm and a grant to restore the house was applied for and received. Work is still going on at the house, one of Nicholas County's oldest.)

Note: The Old Stone House, built in 1725, is located on Route 48, near Blue Lake in Nicholas County. Originally an inn, the twelve-room structure served an important way station for those who traveled "Smith's Wagon-Road." The Old Tavern has without the detriment for some 172 years," comments Harry D. Galbreath, president of the Nicholas County Historical Society. "She stands majestically, with her chimneys extended heavenward. The builders, if they were living, would indeed be proud of a job well done."

"I let my brain fantasize under the Old Stone House. There are memories of happiness and sadness. My mother and father purchased the Old House and the farm, which then consisted of some 100 acres. We moved from Fayette County to our new home in the spring of 1926. The Old House was my home during my four-year tenure at Carlisle High School.

The many stories handed down by my ancestors are so numerous it would be hard to remember them all. Could the Old House talk, it could tell stories of

happiness, love and sadness. All down to 172 years it has sheltered mankind. If the walls of the house could speak, they could tell stories that would reverberate against the hills of Nicholas County, and the echo of its voice could be heard all over the nation.

The Old House had cherished memories for me, as I have heard my forebears tell so many tales of happenings in its domain. It was attractive to me during my journey home.

My brother and I slept upstairs, where there was never any light. I would munch my pie, drink the milk, under and head for the hallway. Upon reaching the door to the bedroom, I would open the door, slam it shut, then hangslings into the bed from the footboard, and land in the middle of the soft feather bed. Sliding under the covers, I would proceed to path my brother out of his room, warm place and take over. Since I was older and stronger, there was nothing he could do except to raise "Holy Cain."

And after all these years, he is still raising "Cain." Come to think of it, I can't much blame him. It was a dirty trick. The Old Stone House was indeed a haven rest. In the cold winter it afforded protection from the icy winds; in the heat of summer its rooms and halls were refreshing and cool, as if came home from school, or from doing

the chores.

One occasion marred the happiness I experienced in the four years I lived in the house; my mother's death. Shortly after her death in June 1930, I married and left the place I loved so well. Occasionally, I would go to see my father, who left the Old House and moved to Carlisle. The John Sopers came into possession of the house but was kind enough to let me visit several times over a period of years. Eventually, the house was abandoned.

My brother and I rereaded old memories by visiting the Old House after it had been deserted. I shall never forget how we walked from room to room and reminisced. As he looked from the hall towards the front door, he said, "Still seems like home." I turned my head and answered, "Yes, it does." I could say no more. The Old House had been abandoned and forgotten by many, but the two men who stood there, surrounded by emptiness, remembered.

I hope that some person, or group of persons, will purchase the Old Stone House so that it might stand forever as a shrine, and a beacon, for those who are interested in things which existed so long ago. I salute you, Old Stone House, as you are today. May you stand forever.
