

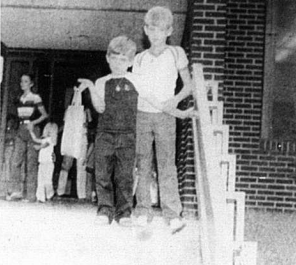
Orphan Brigade to meet again

Thomas Owens, a soldier in the famous First Kentucky Orphan Brigade, was an attorney living in Carlisle back in 1867 when he attended the Orphan's sixth annual reunion at Bardonia 22 years after the Civil War. This event is being recreated by the Nicholas County Historical Society on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 6 and 7, as a feature of Bardonia's Bicentennial Celebration.

Owens' name, with his company and regiment, was listed with 139 other men in a Courier-Journal news story written at the time, as well as 57 ladies, with a description of the ballgown each wore. There were 227 names in all.

The lengthy newspaper article gave a list of 139 men, from generals down to privates, who attended the reunion as well as 57 ladies, with a description of the ballgown each wore. There were 227 names in all.

The Nelson County Historical Society is following the newspaper account as closely as possible in recreating this celebration back in life with all its pomp and pageantry. There will be soldiers in the Blue and Gray, and ladies in late 19th century costumes which emphasized the bustle, the fashion of the times. In addition to persons depicting the reunion era, there will be a Civil War display by the Kentucky Military History Museum as well as individual exhibits.



"It was at Bardonia that Union soldiers were first invited to the Orphan Brigade reunion," explained Erbert Johnson, Historical Society president. "Therefore, we are stressing the fellowship between the two sides. However, for the sake of what we call a 'Museum in Action,' we are having a skirmish on Sunday, Sept. 7."

Morgan's Raiders will stage a capture with the action taking place around the city's court square. Heading the group will be John Jett, who played John Hunt Morgan in "The Other Eden" which was televised on KET last May.

On Saturday evening, Sept. 6, a banquet and "operetta" ball will be held at Wickland "Home of Three Governors" which was, in 1867, the home of Col. J.C. Wickliffe, an Orphan Brigade soldier, who was the son of Wickland's builder, Charles Wickliffe.

Local Little Leaguers place second in tourney

The Nicholas County Little League All-Star Team pounded their way into the final round games of their own Carlisle Little League Invitational Tournament held here last week. Nicholas County fell short in the sixth inning by the stronger Salvation Army Little Leaguers from Lexington.

The All-Stars swept past Bracken County, one of five teams in the tournament, 27-10 in their exhibition game on Monday night.

On Tuesday Nicholas took their first loss of the double elimination tournament by suffering a 17-0 defeat to the Harrison County Twelve-Year-Olds. The game was tied at eight runs after the sixth thru the tenth innings until the Twelve-Year-Olds from Harrison knocked in eight runs in the eleventh as compared to the All-Stars' one.

The loss marked Nicholas County's tournament record 1-1.

Nicholas again failed to break on Wednesday night 13-11 over the

All-Stars into Thursday night's final games. The 19-11 loss to Lexington's Salvation Army team on Thursday, pushed Nicholas out of tournament action and closed-out their tournament record 2-2.

The All-Stars are composed of several Carlisle Little League teams (Dodgers, Cubs, Reds, Blue Jays, Flyers and Royals) and they've competed in various tournaments over the summer. A few weeks ago they returned home from a Mt. Sterling tournament with a second place trophy.

"Our strongest point is hitting," said Billy Keen Anderson, who coaches the All-Stars along with Larry Allison and Leonard Soboy. "We've scored a lot of runs. Those are good kids and I really like the feeling with them. It's fun!"

The All-Star coaching staff was formed from Carlisle's Little League season champions, the Cubs, who boasted a 9-2 season record. Nicholas County's All-Star lineup
