Bluejackets fall to Woodford County

The Nicholas County Bluejackets had a taste of defeat last Friday evening as they fell 80-47 to the Woodford County Yellowjackets.

Even though the Bluejackets played hard and tough throughout the entire game, their efforts were not enough to overcome the powerful Yellowjackets. Coach Mike Kenney stated, "We've got to keep doing what we've been doing. A little bit harder and a little bit more."

Donald Markland tipped the ball over the heads of the Yellowjackets to David McCaffrey letting Nicholas score the first two points of the evening. For the next four minutes, Woodford matched our every shot. The Yellowjackets snatched the ball from Nicholas to score and gained a lead of two points.

As Barry Brett went to the foul line to attempt his free throw shot, Woodford led by a score of 15-12. Brett, concentrating hard on the game, made both with ease, bringing the score 15-14.

At the quarter's end the Bluejackets were trailing by a score of 18-15.

A few minutes in the second quarter McCaffrey assisted Mike Sowell, raising Nicholas' score to 18 while Woodford still held the lead with 23. After a regaining control of the ball McCaffrey assisted Markland, who shot, raising the score to 25-20. McCaffrey brought Nicholas within one, 27-26. The half ended with Woodford leading the Bluejackets 27-26.

Again, to start the half, Markland tipped the ball to Barry Brett. After a succession of shots the jackets came within two points, 45-46. Woodford soon steamed and drove another eight point lead with 1:25 left on the clock. At the end of the third quarter the Bluejackets lagged with a score of 40-52.

To begin the fourth quarter the Bluejackets gained control of the ball when Markland tipped off to Brett. Brett hustled down the court and made a basket for a score to 54 points. Sowell scored the Bluejackets' last basket, bringing the final score to 80-47.

KET quilting series aired

Bonesteel demonstrates more than 20 quilting patterns such as the "rail fence," "king's X" and "shove fly" that can be used in different combinations to create a stunning quilt.

For those who don't want to give up an electric blanket for a bed quilt, Bonesteel shows how to use the quilted blocks for wall hangings, shoulder bags, placemats and other useful items. "Lap Quilting" is a production of The University of North Carolina Television Network.

Safety suggestions for Christmas trees

The state fire marshal's office is discouraging the use of "natural" Christmas trees in public places due to the accompanying fire hazards.

Fire Marshal Gayle Horn suggested using caution when selecting artificial trees for holiday decoration. The tree should have a label from a recognized testing laboratory. Indirect lighting should be used on metallic trees, not electric cords and bulbs.

Real trees placed in the home should be cut at least one inch above the original cut, then placed in water or wet sand sufficient to cover the cut at all times. Water should be added daily. These guidelines apply to both treated and untreated trees.

The Christmas tree must be at least five feet away from open flame. In fact, a natural tree should never be placed near any heat source since this dries it out.

When a natural tree stops absorbing water, it should be removed immediately. Do not place undue confidence in a liquid compound, chemical or paint flame retardants, said state fire officials. Most will not prevent Christmas tree fires.
