## Agree or Not

### Kentucky keeps pace with average population growth

FRANKFORT — Preliminary population figures released last week by the Census Bureau indicate that Kentucky has kept pace with the average in population growth and will not lose or gain any seats in the U.S. House of Representatives.

The 45 House seats are apportioned out to the states on the basis of population while each state has two U.S. Senators. You simply divide the total population (26 million) by 45 to find the number of persons in each House district.

Preliminary population figures were released for 49 states, all except New York, where fire destroyed census figures and the work has to be done over.

Kentucky gained 131 percent in population from a total of 2,220,711 in 1970 to 3,232,143. Kentucky now has seven House seats and has kept pace in population growth since the 1960 census when the state lost one House seat because of the great exodus of people from the coal-producing areas of the state in the slump of the late 1950s.

The state's population shows that

the coal areas have regained a lot of that population since then and the Bluegrass area has gained considerably. Jefferson County was the major loser in population but the growth in other parts of the state more than made up for this loss.

New York state had about 18.5 million people in 1970, but has lost or not gained according to an Associated Press report last week. New York is expected to lose four seats, and losing two each will be Illinois, Ohio and Pennsylvania. Losing one will be Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey and South Dakota.

If predicted to gain seats are Florida with three while California and Texas are losing one each.

Gaining one seat will be Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Oregon, Tennessee, Utah and Washington. The big shift in population has been to the south and the western states.

While Kentucky probably will not gain or lose a seat, it will be necessary to redistrict to balance out the population shift. Jefferson County now has one full House seat and parts of the county are in the Fourth Congressional District.
