Economical New Year's Dinner

If this column serves a bit personal this week, please forgive me. As I tried to think of a change from the traditional black-eyed peas and smoked john, my mind went back to the New Year's dinner served in my family. We observed the traditional custom of serving an economical or frugal dinner. However, the meal was essentially made up of leftover food from Christmas week. As I remember it seems the only necessary addition was perhaps a vegetable.

The main dish naturally was turkey hash, though it was NEVER called that. It was "Turkey Supreme" and served from an English silver revolving tureen. As one of our guests once said, when the top was rolled back she always expected a white dove or something beautifully fantastic to fly out. The hash was served on either squares of cornbread or hot biscuits. Usually hot buttered peas were served as the vegetable. The salad was a combination of left over molded salads — two of this, three of that, cranberry relish, etc. There was always a relish dish made up of left over green and ripe olives, a variety of pickles and a few carrot and celery sticks. You would be surprised at how they will freshen and crisp up if you put in a bowl of ice water in the refrigerator on New Year's morning, or the night before. The dessert was always "Tippy Cake," either made from the pound cake or pecan cake served at Christmas — sometimes one of each.

Since our family was small, the most important thing was to have company. If you look around you, you will find someone who is sure to be alone that day. It is true, the more the merrier. The day before New Year's, while my mother made the Turkey Supreme, everyone else took down Christmas decorations and got the house back to normal. The rest of the food was checked. Tippy Cake made, and

TURKEY SUPREME

First remove every bit of meat from the carcass and cut into bite size pieces, if possible, leave the rest in shivers. Soak in a kettle pot of broken corn and cover with water. Add bay leaf, two or three ribs of celery, salt, pepper, corn, one carrot cut in strips, and pinch of thyme. Bring to a boil and simmer several hours. Strain. The amount of broth you use will depend on how much turkey you have left. To the broth used, add a bouillon cube, leftover gravy, Worcestershire sauce, turkey, canned olives or fresh mushroom, one large pimiento sliced, and thicken with cornstarch. When cool refrigerate overnight until ready to heat for dinner.

TIPSY CAKE

Be sure to make the day before. Slice cake — either pound cake, pecan cake or fruit cake. On each slice drizzle about a tablespoon of whiskey, sherry or brandy. The amount depends on size of slice and taste. Cover with whipped cream. Continue until cake is used and used with whipped cream. Refrigerate overnight. To serve, slice down through the cake so there will be a layer of cake, layer of cream, and so.
