FmHA announces loans for gasohol production

The U.S. Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) has announced that \$100 million is available for on-farm production of gasohol and other petroleum saving uses of fuel and energy.

William E. Burnett, State Director, announced that national commodity contracts have been awarded for the use of FmHA farm real estate and production loans for "energy alternatives" that are shown to be reliable and applicable for financing of fuel-alcohol or other energy devices that applicants propose to install on their farms.

Assembly changed over years

Legislation has always had decisions for the academy were Samuel Smith, William Birdsong, John Whitwell, Richard Hayes, Philip Sharp, John Walker and William Mitchem.

One act passed during an 1813 session of the general assembly provided for the purchase of Main Street lots in Louisville, between cross street numbers three and cross street number six, to pave in front of their lots as far as the middle of the street.

Powers were vested in commissioners to superintend a lottery within three years to improve navigation of the Kentucky River. Commissioners were James Morrison, Abner Ingram, John Hunt, Lewis Sanders and Samuel Macoun.

In Bourbon County, two tracts of 600 acres each were authorized to David Irvine, but to his father Christopher Irvine, who was killed in General Logan's 1781 campaign.

An amendment to the law on appropriation of land acquired by the Treaty of Tellico was made and any installment unpaid when the world cause such land to revert to the commonwealth.

One act amended the law establishing a turnpike leading from Madison and Lincoln counties to the Green Creek Salt Works.

Martin Hawkins was ordered to remove a dam that crossed the Kentucky River at the eastern branch at Fishburn Landing. The law was found to be injurious to navigation of the river. A contract was ordered to have a well on the public square in Port
