The major lobbyists who are hired fulltime to look after public affairs and governmental interests for the corporations or associations are usually well informed on their subjects. They have a battery of skilled lawyers behind them who carefully research every bill introduced that will affect their private interests or be harmful to the public.

They know what they are talking about when they discuss legislation of members of the General Assembly or appear before a legislative committee to explain their position on the bill and sometimes point out bad features that would affect the public as a whole.

While a lot of reporters here write about lobbyists and sometimes try to point them out by characterizing them as lobbyists, it is known that the Courier-Journal employs an attorney full time to look after the legislative interests and report to them. The Courier-Journal also has a law firm that watches bills that might be detrimental to that newspaper and newspaper as a whole in Kentucky.

The cardinal rule of an experienced lobbyist is never to lie or to misrepresent legislation in discussions with legislators. He loses his effectiveness if he is caught in a lie or gets a reputation for misrepresentation.

Less than one-third of the bills introduced in a legislative session are passed and become laws. Many are very bad bills, and believe it or not, some are introduced that the sponsor never expects to become law. The sponsor introduces it for a constituent. Some also are introduced as punitive or harassment purposes against the public or private enterprise.

Let's take a look at one simple little bill. HB 32, introduced by Rep. Clayton Little. "Create new sections of KRS Chapter 47 and 82 require ordinances enacted by local governments to agree permanently effective."

Imagine how large the ballot would be in some places. Also imagine how difficult it would be for city governments to operate. Turnout would prevail every year.

I would hate to see the products of a legislative session when no lobbyist appeared to argue their case in the legislative process.
