If you think soup is just for cold winter days, think again. For cold soups, a hot day served with a thin sandwich and a light dressing makes a delightful summer meal.

**SPANISH SOUP**  
1 (15-ounce) can tomato sauce  
1 (15-ounce) can tomato juice  
1/2 cup finely chopped celery  
1/2 cup finely chopped cucumber  
1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper  
1/4 cup chopped avocado  
1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper  
1 tablespoon parsley flakes  
2 tablespoons wine vinegar  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
1 teaspoon salt

**CHILLED SPINACH SOUP**  
1 (16-ounce) package fresh spinach  
2 packages frozen spinach  
1 teaspoon nutmeg  
2 chicken bouillon cubes  
1/2 cup light cream  
If you have a blender, blend, clean and cool. If not, add five minutes in very little water. Add bouillon and nutmeg and toss. Heat to a boil, add spinach and liquid, and blend until smooth.

3 ripe avocados, peeled and chopped

### County must pay minerals tax

An attorney General's opinion released Monday said that Nicholas County must pay the new state severance tax on rock it sells from the county-owned quarry.
