Arnold, Ford named to interim committees

State Sen. Ed Ford of Cynthiana and Rep. Adrian Arnold of Mt. Sterling have been informed of their assignments to interim joint committees for the 1980-81 biennium.

The appointments were approved at a recent meeting of the Legislative Research Commission. Interim joint committees are formed by merging similar standing committees from the Senate and House.

Chairman of the two former committees will serve as co-chairman of the joint committee and will divide their duties during the interim period.

Committees are responsible for gathering information on specific issues, listening to public testimony and preparing legislation for possible action in the next regular or special session of the General Assembly.

Arnold's assignments are Counties and Special Districts (co-chairman) and the Legislative Program Review and Investigations Committee. Ford will serve on Banking and Insurance and Education, Personal Service Contract Review, Subcommittees and a Special Solar Energy Advisory Committee.

State co-ops get power rate hikes

Approximately a one million Kentuckians, including Nicholas Countians served by Fleming-Mason RECC and Harrison RECC, will start paying more for their electricity because of a \$1.34 million rate increase recently granted to the East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. of Winchester.

The increase, which became effective July 1, will affect consumers in more than 90 central and Eastern Kentucky counties served by the 18 cooperatives that buy power from East Kentucky. The annual increase was approved granted to the two cooperatives that serve Nicholas County are: Harrison RECC, \$209,000 and Fleming-Mason RECC, \$461,000.

Local guard goes to camp

Advance elements of the 201st Engineer Battalion, Kentucky Army National Guard, arrived at Ft. Knox last week as the Ashland-based unit starts its 15-day annual training period.

Commanded by Lt. Col. Edward L. Gill of Frankfort, the battalion is headquartered in Ashland with subordinate units in Olive Hill, Cynthiana, Carlisle, Jackson and Hazard.

In addition to its three companies assigned to Fort Knox, the 201st will have individual companies undergoing training at the Lexington-Burgess Army Depot, Boone National Guard Center in Frankfort and at the Guard's training site at Central City.

"We view this period as an excellent opportunity for our individual units to operate on their own and to concentrate on their engineer missions," Col. Gill stated.

About 900 persons will be involved with the 201st and its attached 30th Engineer Company. The units will return to their armories on Saturday, July 26.

The battalion's Headquarters Company, based in Ashland, will provide direct support to each of the other companies, according to Col. Gill.

Among the construction projects at Fort Knox will be a range for training crews for the new XM-1 tank, the Army's latest.

"Our emphasis will be on mission-related projects rather than tactical considerations," the battalion commander added.
