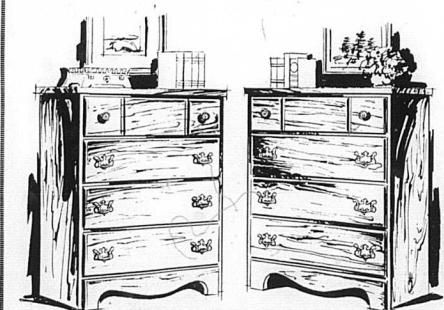

## Local team goes to state softball meet

The Golden Gals softball team competed in the Kentucky State ASA Softball tournament in Owensboro July 19-20. Twenty-three teams consisting of girls 13-15 competed in the junior division.

The Golden Gals team is made up of girls from Carlisle, Paris and Millersburg, and this was their first year to compete in state tournament play. Mary Lyons, Mickey Hawkins and Patricia Small represent Carlisle on the team.

The Golden Gals began play at 9 a.m. Saturday by defeating the Little Hunters of Island, Ky. 11-10. At a delayed 3 p.m. game they were defeated by Hutche's Harom of Maysville 9-4. They later posted a 2-0 win over Hanous Hunterettes of Hanson, Ky. in five innings of play.

The Golden Gals then had to run from one playing field to another and be in position before midnight to complete in their fourth game which was scheduled for 10 p.m. but delayed by earlier play. In this game they posted a 16-13 win over the Vine Grove All Stars of Radcliff, Ky. ending play at 1:45 a.m. The Gals had played 28 innings in a 17-hour span.

Play resumed on Sunday, with the quarter-finals kicking off at noon at the same field where the Golden Gals had faced their only other defeat the day before. Although the Gals won home team advantage on the coin toss, the Owensboro Burger Queen Royals had a much bigger advantage. Last year's state tournament winners had a team roster twice the size of Golden Gals and what appeared to be most of Owensboro turning out to cheer them. Under a blazing sun in temperatures of more than 100 degrees the Gals were defeated. Even after this defeat, they were ranked No. 4 in the State.

Local players Lyons and Hawkins posted triples and doubles in their play, with Small posting a double. The Gals are coached by Roy Sapp and Ward Shannon of Millersburg, both former residents of Nicholas County.

Other team members are Candy Sullivan, Melissa Marvel, Delana Shannon, Terri Johnson, Michelle Sapp, Justine Ricksie, Debbie Green, Tonya Harvey, Tammy Tolliver, Angie Duckworth and Jennifer Dennis.

Mr. and Mrs. Donnie Hawkins and Mr. Ewell Lyons of Carlisle were among parents, supporting merchants and friends accompanying the girls to Owensboro.

## Country Music Festival set

Fest will be stamping and fiddle bows flying at the Country Music Festival to be held Aug. 17 at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington.

A fiddlers' contest will open the day 10 p.m. The contest is open to the first 10 fiddlers to register by the Aug. 13 deadline. Only individuals with no more than two backup instruments will compete and there will be no electrical amplification allowed. Fiddlers are to perform two tunes each. Cash prizes ranging from \$10 to \$25 will be awarded in five categories.

A concert featuring two country music bands, Breeding's Bush and Stony Creek, both from Lexington, will be underway at 9 p.m.

Tickets for the contest and the concert are \$2.50 in advance, \$3 at the gate. Children 12 and under are admitted free. There is no additional charge to enter the park for the festival.
