**Food prices up 10%**

A marketbasket of 40 selected staple food items cost an average of 10 cents more in Kentucky food stores during June than in May.

The 30-item grouping cost an average of \$1.17 this month, according to the findings of Kentucky Farm Bureau's marketbasket food price survey, which checked supermarket lists in 20 communities around the state.

The June survey's price increase, which amounted to a gain of just two-tenths of one percent over May, was attributed to higher prices for T-bone steaks, arctic roast, pork chops, cheese, apples and Idaho potatoes.
