## Wanted: a mother

The Babe Ruth League baseball program in Nicholas County needs a mother — or even an interested father.

What the league needs specifically, is someone to oversee the concession stands at the games. The revenues from the concession stands are used to purchase trophies for the boys and teams honored after the season ends. If the stands can't make that revenue, the boys might not get those trophies.

Babe Ruth baseball fills a gap in Nicholas County sports. It's for boys ages 13 to 15 and offers something for boys who are too old for Little League but might be sitting on the bench at NCHS waiting for their chance. League president Clifton Waugh thinks part of the reason the Bluejackets have such a successful baseball program is because Babe Ruth is around for a boy that might be interested in honing his baseball skills.

But because of its affiliation with other Babe Ruth Leagues the Little Leagues are in April and finish their season by July, in order to qualify for regional and state competition. The league plays its games at

the Recreation Park and usually starts its season before the park and lights are quite ready for them.

Daylight Savings Time may take care of the second problem and work is progressing on the field itself. But unless an interested mother or father is found to run the concession stands Waugh feels the program will die from lack of attention.

"You have to give a boy something to show him he's accomplished something," he said. "I don't think the league would be the same if we couldn't afford the trophies and the picnic at the end of the season."

The ages of 13 and 15 are often a turning point in a young man's life, the time when he decides which path in life he chooses to follow. At that age the experience of playing a team sport is perhaps more important than for the Little and Minor Leaguers.
