### Press group reaffirms rape policy

The board of directors of the Kentucky Press Association has reaffirmed its policy in opposition to publication of names of rape victims and other sex crime victims.  
The KPA said it opposes the publication of victims' names except in extraordinary circumstances, such as homicide, missing persons, or aggravated assault against the offender.  
During the recent session of the General Assembly, legislation was introduced which would seal police records of rape victims and other sex crime victims.  
The legislation failed to pass after the press association opposed it on the grounds that it would prohibit the press from performing a proper job in investigating as to whether rape and sex crime victims had been treated properly by the police, prosecutors and counseling agencies.  
The KPA has sent copies of its policy to all Kentucky newspapers and to Kentucky police agencies and prosecutors.
