Whereas the County of Nicholas has received an estimated revenue from the State for the Road and Budget Fund for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 1980, and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Nicholas, Kentucky:

SECTION ONE: The annual budget for Fiscal Year 1979-1980 shall be:

1. All increase receipts of the Road and Budget Fund of \$122,150.00 to include \$1535.00 in miscellaneous revenue and \$120,615.00 in miscellaneous revenue for Millwood-Park.

BETTER BERRIES - Correct preparation of strawberries pays off in flavor and texture. Refrigerate one layer deep to avoid bruising. Wash berries just before serving and remove the caps after washing to prevent growing rotting mold.

SUN POWER - Summer brings more than heat - it brings vitamins, protein and energy. When water becomes milder, wash immediately. If stain remains, saturate with a mixture of lemon juice and salt. Dry in the hot sun.

SAVAGE OPERATION - Here's a tip for the pro: care and feeding of moths. To eliminate the white clothes blemish, mix permanent blue ink and water until you have as close a color match as you can get. Paint on the white creases and let dry.
