After last week's recipe for "Hannibal Hood", these responses may seem a bit odd. However they are more palatable, and will be "rearranging" for these nippy autumn evenings."

SPICED CIDER RUM PUNCH
Combine in a saucepan 6 cups of apple cider, 4 cups packed brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon cloves and simmer the mixture for five minutes. Stir in 1/2 cup dark rum. Serve hot in heated mugs or glasses. You may want to float 1/2 teaspoon butter on top of each serving.

HOT CRANBERRY TEA
1 pound fresh cranberries
3 quarts water
1 lemon, juiced
3 oranges, juiced
2 1/2 cups sugar
2 sticks cinnamon
1 teaspoon whole cloves
Cook cranberries and water together until berries pop. Add orange and lemon juices, sugar, cinnamon and cloves. Simmer 20 minutes. Strain and serve hot. Serves 20 punch cups full.

INSTANT RUSSIAN TEA
1/2 cup plain instant tea
1/2 cup sugar
2 cups instant dry orange breakfast drink
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 package instant lemonade mix

Mix together. To serve use cup, stir three teaspoons of mix into cup and fill with boiling water.

CUF OF CHEER
1 cup sugar
12 whole cloves
2 sticks cinnamon
3 cups grapefruit juice
2 cups orange juice
1 quart cider
Combine sugar, 1/2 cup water, the cloves and cinnamon in saucepan and bring to boiling. Reduce heat and simmer 20 minutes. Strain.

In large bowl combine fruit juices and cider; mix well. Stir in sugar syrup, Ribbit, and serve hot. This punch is also very good served chilled. It may be made up to two weeks ahead and reheated over and over, as needed. If desired, garnish with orange slices and cinnamon sticks.

CINNAMON RUM SWIRL
1 cup light brown sugar
1 cup boiling water
3 quarts apple cider
1 quart rum
2 cups orange juice
Cinnamon sticks

In large saucepan dissolve sugar in boiling water. Add cider and heat to boiling. Add rum and orange juice. Heat, but do not boil. Pour into heated bowl. Serve in punch cup; use cinnamon sticks as stirrers.
