World's largest sheep show now underway in Louisville

Beginning Saturday, Nov. 15, and continuing through Friday, Nov. 21, more than 5,000 sheep representing 11 breeds, will enter the showing at the North American International Livestock Exposition, Louisville.

This large number of entries makes the sheep show at the North American International the largest indoor sheep show in the world.

The prestige and quality of the North American International Sheep Show is reflected in the total amount of premiums and awards offered - over \$48,000 in all.

Many national sheep shows are held in conjunction with the Expo,

including Suffolk, Oxford, Hampshire, and Southdown. Other breeds having shows will include Dorset, Columbia, Rambouillet, Montadale, Shropshire, Cotswold, and Cheviot.

Also featured events during the Sheep Show will be the colorful North American International Ladies Land Classes; the Junior Breeder Sheep Show; the Junior Market Lamb Show; and the selection of Supreme Champion.

Several National Sheep breed associations will conduct their annual meetings during the North American International, as well as, other events of importance to the nation's sheep breeders.

Todd Burnett of Sacramento, Calif., was one of the first sheep exhibitors to arrive at the North American International Livestock Exposition Nov. 8-21 at the Kentucky State Fair and Exposition Center, Louisville. Approximately 3,500 entries in the sheep show, plus others in dairy and beef cattle, quarter horses and swine make the North American International the world's largest all-breed livestock show. Since it takes three to four hours to groom one Suffolk sheep, Burnett and his fellow exhibitors put clean blankets and hoods over the animals to keep them clean until it's time to enter the show ring.
