## Cooperation sought for farmer

Farmers, your cooperation is needed on end of year surveys. Dave Williamson, statistician in charge of the Kentucky Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, says participation on these surveys is voluntary, but very necessary to arrive at accurate agricultural statistics and assure that your area is properly represented.

Mail questionnaires and personal interviews will be used to gather information on final output of 1980 crops; fall wheat seedings; cattle, hog, chicken and sheep inventory numbers; and other agricultural commodities. The 1980 County acreage, yield and production will be estimated from these reports, giving a factual picture of drought damage by areas.

National and State estimates on hogs and pigs on farms and winter wheat acreage needed will be released Dec. 20. Final 1980 crop estimates and cattle inventory numbers will be issued in Jan. 1981. Copies of each report are available from the Kentucky Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, P.O. Box 1120, Louisville, KY 40201.
