Kay's Kitchen

It is later than you think! If you have baked your Christmas cake, the one with all the fruit and nuts, you have a good start in making the holiday season easier. Don't leave any baking to the last minute that can be done, or at least get part of it done. The recipes this week are for things to make now, and enjoy later. The following recipe, you make now and store in the refrigerator until time to bake. They will keep more than 8 months.

- ICE BOX COOKIES**
- 1/2 cup brown sugar (You may use half white and half brown)
 - 1 egg, beaten
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup nuts, finely chopped (either walnuts or pecans)
 - 3 cups sifted flour, approximately
- Cream butter and sugar, add egg, salt, vanilla, nut and enough flour to make a dough that can be handled. Divide dough in half and roll each half in wax paper, pushing and pulling about 1/4 to 1/2 inches apart. When dough is smooth and round, wrap each roll in wax paper, then in aluminum foil. With pastry wheel cut into 1/2 inch strips, 1/2 inch wide. Sprinkle with colored sugars. Place strips on a butter size roll.
- When ready to cook, slice very thin, place on cookie sheet, and bake 375 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes. Time depends on size of roll, and how thin cookies are sliced. Do not brown cookies, except just around the edges. It allows the flavors to blend.

- CHEESE STRAWNS**
- 1 cup sifted flour
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
 - 1/2 cup butter or margarine
 - 1 cup grated sharp Cheddar cheese
 - 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon celery seed or sesame seed
- Cream butter and sugar, add egg, salt, vanilla, nut and enough flour to make a dough that can be handled. Divide dough in half and roll each half in wax paper, pushing and pulling about 1/4 to 1/2 inches apart. When dough is smooth and round, wrap each roll in wax paper, then in aluminum foil. With pastry wheel cut into 1/2 inch strips, 1/2 inch wide. Sprinkle with colored sugars. Place strips on a butter size roll.
- When ready to cook, slice very thin, place on cookie sheet, and bake 375 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes. Time depends on size of roll, and how thin cookies are sliced. Do not brown cookies, except just around the edges. It allows the flavors to blend.

These delightful rolls can be made now and frozen until ready to use.

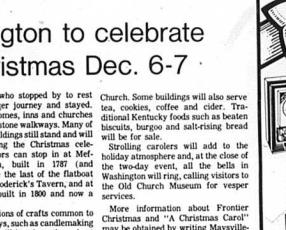
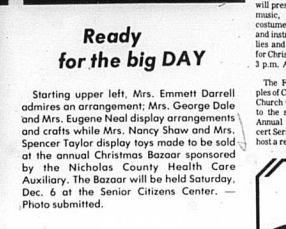

Old Washington to celebrate frontier Christmas Dec. 6-7

Some of Kentucky's earliest Christmas celebrations by settlers who, after floating down the Ohio River in flatboats, drifted onto the Kentucky shores and stayed to build villages and homes in the late 18th century. This year, citizens of Old Washington, in northern Kentucky's Mason County, will again recreate those early days with the celebration of Frontier Christmas, Dec. 6-7. During the weekend, visitors will find themselves two centuries back in time. Established as a town in 1786, Washington was the first community in the nation to be named for George Washington. By 1790 it was a bustling town, the second largest in Kentucky, filled with settlers who stopped by to rest after their rugged journey and stayed. Soon sturdy homes, inns and churches lined the wide stone walkways. Many of those early buildings still stand and will be open during the Christmas celebration. Visitors can stop in at McFadden's Station, built in 1787 (and believed to be the last of the flatboat houses), at Broderick's Tavern, an archaic Paxton Inn, built in 1800 and now a museum. Demonstrations of crafts common to those early days, such as candlemaking and quilting, will be given throughout the celebration. Christmas dinner will be served at Broderick's Tavern and Haven's Chapel United Methodist Church. Some buildings will also serve tea, cookies, coffee and cider. Traditional Kentucky foods such as beaten biscuits, burgoo and salt-cracking bread will be for sale. Strolling carolers will add to the holiday atmosphere and, at the close of the two-day event, all the bells in Washington will ring, calling visitors to the Old Church Museum for vesper services.
