VFW shooting

Robert Jackson Hopkins, Mayville Road, Carlisle, has been charged with the shooting death of Donald Dale McCullough, 26, North Poplar Street, Cynthiana.

The shooting occurred about 9:30 p.m. Wednesday at the V.F.W. post at 214 South Walnut Street, Cynthiana. McCullough was shot twice in the head.

Cynthiana police have been unable to determine a motive for the shooting of McCullough. City Patrolman John H. Hiten was the arresting officer.

McCullough was pronounced dead upon arrival at Harrison Memorial Hospital.

The V.F.W. has since been closed pending an investigation.

Tests Oct. 21

Brenda Anderson, director of guidance at Nicholas County High School, has announced that students taking the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT/NMSQT) on Oct. 21 will benefit from additional services in 1980.

These services are designed to provide students with more information about the content and uses of the test.

Students who plan to take the 1980 PSAT/NMSQT will receive a complete sample test for practice, along with an answer key and scoring instructions. When scores are reported in December, each student will receive a Report of Student Averages, including the correct answers as well as the answer to the student gave. Any parent who feels that their children may qualify for this program return test booklets with scores. Students will continue to receive "About Your PSAT/NMSQT Scores," a booklet of general information on college planning.

Local DHR takes part in National Week

The Department for Human Resources, Bureau for Manpower Services, is participating in National Employ the Handicapped Week Oct. 5-11.

In Nicholas County 13 out of 200 applicants and renewals were handicapped and four of the 13 were placed in jobs for a placement rate of 31 percent. It was stated that one out of 11 Americans are handicapped.

Handicapped workers have made great progress in entering the job market, but much remains to be done. Many qualified handicapped people are unemployed because of discriminatory attitudes rather than an inability to perform. Many buildings still have architectural barriers that prevent handicapped persons from getting jobs.

Handicapped workers have earned a reputation for being reliable, safe, conscientious and for having excellent production records.

It was also reported that eight citizens have been rehabilitated and 31 are now receiving rehabilitation services.

Employers are challenged to find the means to better integrate handicapped persons into the work force. Hire the Handicapped!

Financial burden continues for state on Maxey Flats site

Kentucky must continue to carry the full financial burden for perpetual care and protection of the now-closed Maxey Flats nuclear waste disposal site, with little help from the federal government.

A special legislative advisory committee recently heard from U.S. Department of Energy spokesmen

Louise Dreeson on the federal government's long-range plans to deal with low-level waste disposal.

Dreeson said Energy Department plans call for the development of various publications and technical handbooks dealing with the handling and disposal of low-level waste materials as early as 1983.

Stabilization techniques for shallow waste disposal sites such as Maxey Flats would be covered in future publications expected by 1984.
