Friends speak of going to the apple orchard, one sees baskets of delicious looking apples at the markets, and you know the apple season is here and we long for the first juicy bite of an apple grown nearby. So let your favorite for eating and...

GINGER APPLE COMPOSITE
4 medium size apples
1 cup sugar
2 cups water
1 two-inch stick cinnamon
4 whole cloves
1/2 cup chopped candied ginger
1/2 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup flour
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup oil
1/2 cup nuts

INDIA APPLE DESSERT
4 large apples
1 cup orange juice
1 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup chopped blanched almonds
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1 tablespoon confectioner's sugar
Fare, core and slice apples into casserole. Add orange juice, 1/2 cup of the cream, nut meals and nutmeg. Cover and bake in moderately hot oven (375-400 degrees) for about 30 minutes or until apples are done.

APPLE PEPPER RELISH
2 sweet red peppers
2 large sweet onions, peeled
3 cooking apples, peeled and cored
1/2 cup lemon juice, strained
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup vinegar
1/2 cup oil
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup margarine
1/2 cup finely chopped nuts
1/2 cup heavy cream, whipped
Pure apples and cut in thin slices; arrange layer of sliced apples in bottom of greased baking dish, sprinkle with 1/2 cup brown sugar, and add another layer of apples. Repeat remaining 1/2 cup sugar, flour and chopped nuts; gradually work into margarine that has been

2 or 3 large apples
1 cup firmly packed sugar
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup margarine
1/2 cup finely chopped nuts

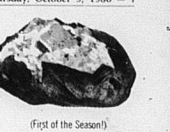
