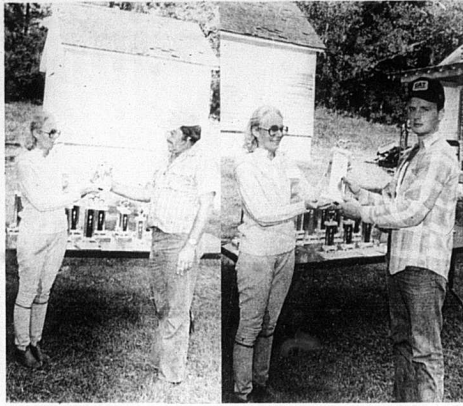
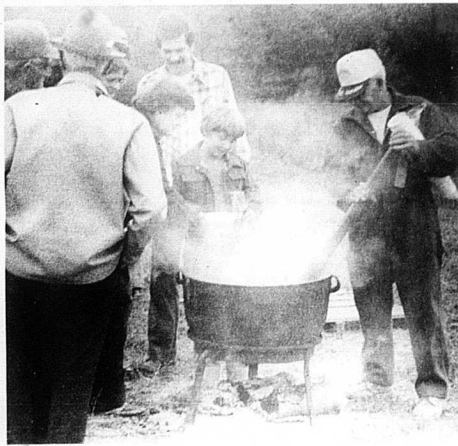


Tally sheets posted

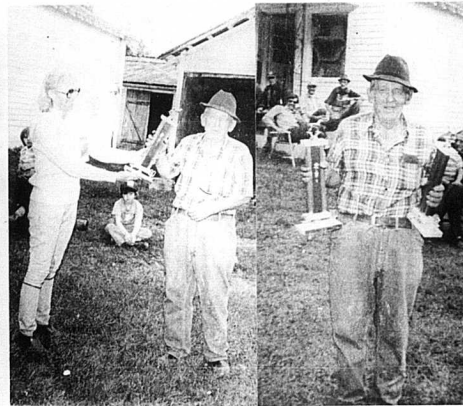

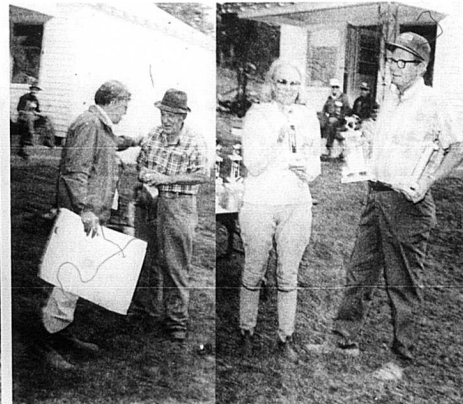
