General Assembly extends deadline for solid-waste plans

FRANKFORT — The deadline set for Kentucky cities and counties to draw up solid-waste management plans was extended from Jan. 1, 1981 to July 1, 1982, with the passage of Senate Bill 308 during the 1980 General Assembly.

While the state's many local governments and area development districts are using this additional 18 months of working time, officials of the state Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection will also be working on new waste-management plans.

"The local and regional plans will deal with four areas of solid waste — residential, commercial, non-hazardous industrial waste and institutional waste. The department, in conjunction with the area development districts and a private contractor, has developed local-regional plans that list several waste management options for each area. The local-regional plans may be used as a resource by local governments," he added.

"What we're developing is less specific than the local plans," said Rose Marie Carr, with the division of hazardous material and waste management. "Rather than make detailed profiles of each area of the state, we are working on an agency management plan which looks at changes the department can make to streamline its activities or revise its policies to make them more efficient."

Carr explained that the plan which the division of hazardous materials is developing will be used within the department to monitor agency progress. This plan will differ in many respects from those required by the legislature from local areas, she said.

The internal plan will deal with all of the nine types of solid wastes recognized by federal environmental officials — wastewater, pollution-control residue, both hazardous and non-hazardous waste, mining waste, agricultural waste, water-treatment facility waste, septick tank waste and waste oil, Carr said.
