State General Fund is up \$8.5 million

The total General Fund is up \$8.5 million or 3.4 percent for the first two months of fiscal 1981 over 1980, ac-cording to a report issued recently by Finance Secretary George Atkins. Atkins said \$1.6 million is in coal Atkins said \$1.6 million is in coal severance; \$.8 million is oil production (due to an increase in rate); and \$8.5 million is in individual income tax (largely due to \$5.9 million more of refunds being made in July 1979 than in July 1980.
