AAA advises public about safety education
Even a short walk along streets and roads can be dangerous for a child. As schools begin another year, the Blue Grass Automobile Club — AAA urges parents to not only explain traffic safety rules to children, but demonstrate them.

Parents should walk the route to school with their children. Show them where to stop and cross the street. Explain that they should never play games along the way or dart out into the road. Tell them how dangerous it is to walk or run between parked cars, because they will be hidden from the view of an oncoming motorist.

Children walking or riding bicycles look small to drivers in automobiles, and they must be careful to make themselves seen.

In areas where there are no sidewalks, show children where to walk: either in the grass or on the extreme outside edge of the street, facing oncoming traffic.

AAA sponsors School Safety Patrol Guards at intersections near many elementary schools. Parents should find out from the school where their children are posted and tell their children to obey their directions. Blue Grass AAA also urges motorists to think about personal driving practices, especially near schools, and always drive as if their own child were walking on the same street.

In addition, there are other easily-corrected conditions which interfere with a driver's ability to act quickly in an emergency. Rain or dirt on the outside and inside film on the inside of a windshield reduce driver visibility. Early morning darkness in the coming months, or driving into the sun, can

Birth info can be charged to credit card
Persons ordering copies of birth or death certificates from the state through Western Union may now charge the order to their VISA or MasterCard, a Department for Human Resources spokesman said today.

Under a new arrangement with Western Union, charge-card holders may call the Human Resources Department to order certificates, then call Western Union, toll-free, to charge the copies. Western Union charges a fee in addition to the state charge of \$4 per certificate copy, said Oscar Greenman, registrar of the department's vital records office.

The toll-free Western Union number is 1-800-648-4900. Previously all applicants had to visit a Western Union telegraph office, buy a money order and send the certificate request by wire, or they had to visit Human Resources personally.

The service costs Human Resources nothing because all costs are covered by the Western Union fees. The Western Union charge to applicants is \$6 regardless of the number of copies ordered. The vital records office number is (502) 564-4212.
