Sawdust, hard work help build Roscommon garden

W.H. and Betty Scott, Roscommon, Mich., believe in living off the land.
 Their main business, Scott's Wood Products, turns wood harvested from area forests into pallets, which are shipped to industry around the state.
 A by-product of that business, sawdust plays an important part in Scott's favorite spare time activity, gardening.
 Scott says by adding lime, manure and a "lot of sawdust," he has built up a garden plot which produced Roscommon's "champion tomato" last year.
 Scott and two other avid Roscommon gardeners had a "Big Tomato Contest" last summer. Although Scott's one pound three ounce entry was slightly smaller than those of Ron Galabala and Joe Brunan, Scott's was declared the winner because it ripened first.
 This year the Scotts are proudly displaying eggplant, watermelons and pumpkins as only part of their garden harvest. Their garden also produces corn, tomatoes, potatoes, cucumbers, beets, carrots, peppers, squash, Swiss chard, peas, beans, dill, radishes, lettuce, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, cauliflower, custard, mushrooms, rhubarb, asparagus, onions and several kinds of squash.
 In addition to vegetables, Scott raises strawberries, raspberries, gooseberries, blackberries, apples and other fruits.
 Nothing from the garden is sold.

1980 Burley loan announced
 The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced the schedule of 1980 loan rates, by various grades, for burley tobacco on August 28. The rates are based on the average level of support of 145.9 cents per pound, about 12.6 percent higher than the 1979 level.
 The rates, which range from 96 cents to \$1.52 per pound, vary according to tobacco quality.
 Tobacco graded "U" (air-cured), "W" (wet), "No-G" (no grade) or scrap for the 1980 crop of burley type 31 will not be accepted.

reads in part, "Due to the inadequate progress the company has made in providing new service to these applicants within a reasonable time period, the commission finds that it is fully justified in reducing the approved fair, just and reasonable rate of return the company has the opportunity to earn to 10.47 percent. Such a penalty is required based on the facts of this case in order to provide an incentive for the company to improve its record in providing requested service within a reasonable time." The penalty reduces the additional revenues granted by \$1,108,000 to \$36,500,000.
 On Nov. 12, 1979, the commission ordered that no applicant for new telephone service should have to wait more than 12 months to obtain it and that South Central Bell should direct its construction efforts toward that goal.
 The commission also noted it had expressed concern about the company's failure to fulfill service obligations on three previous occasions when Bell requested rate increases. Those cases were dated March 26, 1977; Jan. 3, 1978; and Aug. 7, 1979.
 The commission also ordered Bell to allow subscribers to pay service charges on the installment plan and to inform consumers they have opportunity to do so. Service charges cover installing and connecting phones.
