During the game Friday night the Jackets were overcome by the Beechwood Tigers with a score of 36-12. Coach Humphrey stated, "We were

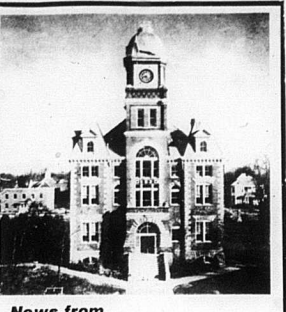
