School Board meeting held

The Nicholas County Board of Education met Thursday night, April 16. A reporter from The Carlisle Mercury was unable to attend the meeting. Superintendent Donald Elder reported to the Mercury the issues he felt were pertinent at this time, as it would take all day to type up the minutes of the meeting, and they would not be available in their entirety by press time.

He reported the following motions which were passed by the board:

- to put Frank Lyons on the substitute bus driver list;
- give permission to Nicholas County High School Ecology Class to hold a stumper pull at high school gym May 5. Proceeds go to March of Dimes;
- give permission to AHS Council to use elementary school May 1 and 2 to prepare for fashion revue;
- to employ Ted Moore and Associates of Cynthiana to conduct the annual audit of financial accounts;
- purchase five I.B.M. Selectric typewriters for typing room at the high school.

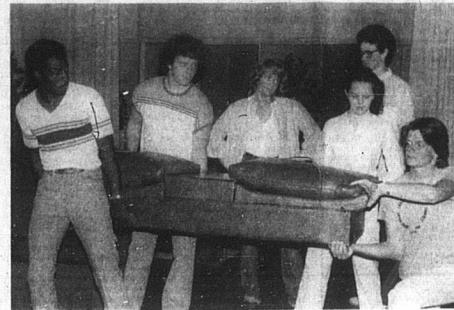
Mr. Elder also stated that the board voted on the certified personnel for the 1981-82 school year and he suggested that the list be published after the next board meeting, May 11, along with the list of non-instructional personnel.

Boy Scouts present Expo

Thirty thousand visitors are expected to view Scouting's annual show, Expo '81, Saturday, May 2, in Lexington's Hippodrome. Four thousand Scouts will present over 100 live action shows simultaneously on the arena floor. Preparations have begun for what Scouts officials term one of the largest shows of its type in America. Cub Scouts, Scouts, and Explorers have begun ticket sales throughout the county and thousands have already been sold. Tickets sell for \$1 each and all proceeds go to support packs, troops, and posts in the Blue Grass Council.

The program will feature such Scouting activities as rappelling, rope bridges, signal towers, camp cooking, first aid, camping, backpacking, rescue, survival demonstrations, crafts, photography, horsemanship, and much more. In addition, a stage show featuring local professional entertainment and celebrities will run continuously throughout the day and a large screen television will be provided for viewing the Kentucky Derby. Also, members of the University of Kentucky basketball team will appear and meet the Scouts.

Keith Ward, newsmen for Channel 27, is the Expo chairman this year. He said, "Last year Expo '79 was one of the most successful Scout shows in the nation. Expo '81 will be even better. This super event promises to be an Expo '81 day to remember."

Blood Drive is re-organized

The Nicholas County Blood Drive has changed chairmanship. Rev. Herman Kamlage, who has chaired the drive for the last three years along with Rev. Mark Prevo, relinquished his duties to Rev. David Stancil. This transition was announced Tuesday night at a re-organizational meeting held at the Nicholas County Hospital by Ma. Carolyn Felish, Central Kentucky Blood Center Donor Service representative.

The drive, which has been under the auspices of the Nicholas County Ministerial Association since its inception in 1975 with Rev. H. Dallas Sugg as chairman, is changing directions. There will be no sponsoring organization leading the drive, but a committee headed up by Rev. Stancil with representatives from county clubs and organizations responsible for the following committees: reception, donor center (supplies), donor center (volunteer staff), donor records file, sales phone recruiters, mail for workers, and coordinating staff. Many of the volunteers who have helped the drive in the past will continue to perform their same duties.

Those present at Tuesday night's meeting were: Tommy Vaughn, member of Carlisle City Council; Mrs. Dorsey Lynn Watkins, president of the Nicholas County Homemakers; Mrs. Wayne Shumate, president of the Carlisle Garden Club; Mrs. Reese Snow, president of the Nicholas County Health Care Auxiliary; and Rev. Stancil, Rev. Kamlage, and Rev. Prevo, representatives of the Ministerial Association. Also present was Bob Hester, Nicholas County Health Care Administrator.

Ma. Felish commented that Nicholas County has one of the most efficiently run blood drives in her area, pointing out that the donor record file which is of vital importance to the success of the drive, is especially well kept. She also informed those present that the goal for Nicholas County is 200 pints, and that this goal has been met every year for the last three years.

Ma. Felish announced that the tentative dates for the next two drives in the county are August 3 and October 19. Also the tentative schedule for 1982 is: March 8, August 8 and November 8.
