Most of us are thinking about the Kentucky Derby right now - not only about the race, but what to serve at that special dinner, get-together, brunch or what have you, because Derby time is fun entertainment. As in the race, a good start is important to any party, any time of day or night.

Call them hors d'oeuvres, canapés or appetizers, here are some recipes to give you a good start.

SALMON TURNOVERS

1 (pound) can salmon
1 slices ham
1/2 cup condensed Cheddar cheese soup
1 teaspoon horseradish
1 teaspoon instant minced onion
Dash pepper
1 egg margarine or butter, softened
1 cup sharp shredded cheese, or glass of sharp cheese
2 cups all purpose flour
Dash oil

DASH CRISP

1/2 cup cream cheese, Fry bacon until crisp, drain on paper and crumble. Combine salmon, ham, soup, horseradish, minced onion and pepper. Prepare pastry by creaming the butter and cheese, adding flour and seasoning and mixing thoroughly. Shape dough into a ball and chill at least three hours. When the pastry is chilled, roll very thin and cut into 2-1/2-inch squares. Place a heaping teaspoon of the salmon mixture on one half of each square. Fold over and press edges together with tinfoil-lined baking pan. Prick top with a fork. Bake in a 400 oven for 15 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes about 80 turnovers.

Using the above pastry recipe, you may use any of these fillings. Ham and turkey, turkey, beef, chicken, salmon, tuna, shrimp, etc.
