Readers of major national business publications should know less about "Kentucky & Co." That's the slogan that has appeared in dozens of advertisements, pitching the advantages of locating a new advertising campaign in a \$1 million advertising campaign began in January to woo new corporate residents to Kentucky, and most of the ads have featured Gov. John Y. Brown Jr. as the president and chief executive officer of "Kentucky & Co."

Alabama boasts that governor-businessman "Bob James was president of a business before he was governor."

Still other states use the opposite approach, such as Virginia's ad picturing a group of men in a country store with the slogan that "The business climate of the entire state of

# Immunizations are available at local Health Department

Of the 52 million children in the United States who are under the age of 18, more than 10 million have not been immunized against one or more of the childhood diseases. In other words, almost 40 percent of our children are in no later than three months of age. This schedule should be continued at irregular intervals. If your children were not immunized when they were infants, contact the health center and arrange to start them on immunization program. Those entering Head Start, kindergarten, first grade, 14-year-olds and those new to the Nicholas County School System next fall should have their immunization records updated. Even adults need a tetanus booster every 10 years. All of the above immunizations are given at the health center the last Tuesday and Wednesday of each month.
