Pallbearers were Jewell Vest, Quinton Snapp, Phillip and Virgil Poynter, Kenneth and Steve Gaunce.

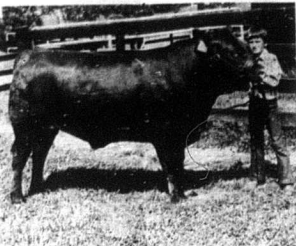
## Kendall places fifth in national rifle championship

Carlisle's Pevs Kendall placed fifth overall last week in the National Smallbore Rifle Championship held at Camp Perry, Ohio. Kendall, considered by many to be the foremost expert on smallbore rifery in the United States, won the event in 1962, 1972 and 1974. In this year's competition, Kendall scored 623 out of a possible 640, only three points out of first place. In 540 shots, Kendall scored five bullseyes.

Kendall said that despite the rainy weather, the competition this year was "rip and tuck". He attended the meet representing his two ammunition companies, Lapus Ammunition Company, which is the leading target ammunition company in the United States, and Kendall-Messner Ammunition Company, Ireland, which caters to North and South Ireland, Great Britain and Europe.

While at Camp Perry, Kendall pictured and gave instruction to competitors from all over the world. Kendall's wife, Ann, the current British Smallbore champion, is now in England where she will be competing in the British championship next week.

Wills, "recreation is a very important part of that."  
Following the earlier conference, Wills and Smoot met with A.J. Martin, Deputy Commissioner of Operations for the State Department of Parks. One of Martin's jobs is to allocate revenues produced by offshore drilling leases with the federal government.  
Wills said that while Martin's office is currently undergoing an audit to uncover a \$250,000 "mistake", Martin still seemed concerned about the local project. He said Wills and Smoot that the local Board could expect some word on their funding as early as this fall.  
The local Parks and Recreation Board currently has some \$14,000 in cash, labor and materials to generate matching funds for the \$100,000-\$125,000 project. Wills said Tuesday that in order for the project to become a reality, the Board "will need help from every sector in the community."  
Wills said that one of the major goals of Monday's meeting was to let the state officials know how concerned the community is about the park. He said that in dealing with the state bureaucracy, one cannot sit still and "wait for them to come to you."
