In large pitcher, mix instant tea, sugar, cold water and apricot nectar; stir mixture until sugar dissolves. Just before serving, add frozen lemonade concentrate and several ice cubes; stir. Place three or four additional ice cubes in each of eight tall glasses and pour in fruit mixture until glasses are about two-thirds full. Shake your pitcher. Add ginger ale. Mix gently with an up and down motion. Makes eight servings.

**PEACH-PIÑAAPPLE SHAKE**

In blender container, combine 1 cup sliced fresh peaches, 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 cup chilled unsweetened pineapple juice and 1/2 cup sugar. Blend at high speed until smooth. Add 1 pint vanilla ice cream; cover and blend until softened. Pour into glasses. Makes three or four servings.
