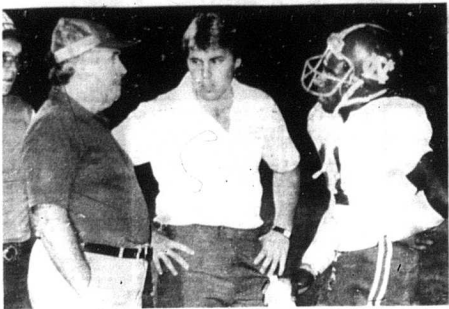

The drive was highlighted by a sideline pass reception by Mike Woosley, and a 13 yard run by Eric McGuffey Hopkins capped the drive with a scoring plunge from the 1 yard line.
Along with the basic package presented by the Jackets Friday night, local fans also got a little wrinkle in the form of a late extra point when kicker Eric McGuffey took the snap directly from center to hit Mike Woosley for a 2 point conversion.

Board reduces assessment

The local Board of Assessment Appeals discharged its duty last week and has now submitted its reductions in the county's property valuation assessment.

According to Nicholas County PVA Rose Brady, the Board reduced the local assessment by \$10,200. That reduction was based on some 43 cases entertained by the Board.
Mrs. Brady said Monday that the \$10,200 reduction should not be enough but that the state will reduce the recapitulation."

These individual reductions are not being processed into the second recapitulation and that recap should be ready for submission to the state for certification around the second week of September.

Mrs. Brady said that once the report is in state hands, it should be either approved or rejected within two weeks. It will then be returned to the local county so individual government agencies can set their tax rates for the year.
Mrs. Brady said it would probably be mid-October or early November before the final tax bills are ready to send out. "I don't think it will be much sooner than that," she said.
