County officials hear plans for Reagan's New Federalism

Two of Kentucky's top county officials heard President Ronald Reagan's ideas as he attempts to reform decision making authority and financial responsibilities over to county and state governments during a Dec. 4 meeting with the President in Washington.

Mike Miller, Marshall County Judge/Executive and President of the Kentucky Association of Counties, and Fred B. Crassey, Executive Director of KACD, were two of more than 100 representatives from county and municipal governments who were visiting the capital for a conference of the National Association of Counties.

During a three-hour meeting, top-level administration officials gave Miller and Crassey a first-hand report on the President's program of New Federalism and the progress it has already made, including the consolidation of 57 categorical grant programs into nine block grants, and the creation of advisory committees on federalism and regulatory reform.

The President told meeting participants that "Americans in recent years have begun to recognize that the steady flow of tax dollars and other powers of Washington has resulted in a government which — at least at the federal level — just doesn't seem to work anymore."

"We have seen the federal government take too much taxes from the people, too much authority from the states, and too much liberty with the Constitution."

Earlier that day, Miller and Crassey heard from Murray Weidenbaum, chairman of the Council of Economic Advisors and a long-time supporter of the general revenue sharing program. While insisting that there would be no "sacred cows" when it comes time to enact further budget cuts, Weidenbaum said that both he and the President support the general revenue sharing program until an alternative

Other speakers at the meeting included Health and Human Services Secretary Richard Schweiker, Transportation Deputy Secretary Darrell Trent, Housing and Urban Development Undersecretary Jane Cook, and Vice President George Bush.

While recognizing all of these positive accomplishments, much work remains to be done," said the President during his closing remarks. Elderly to receive in-home financial aid

The Blue Grass Area Development District will receive \$12,133 for the home care of the elderly under a plan for the allocation of \$1.5 million across the state for in-home aid by the Department for Human Resources.

The money will go to provide homemaker and home health aide services, home-delivered meals, transportation assistance, and chore services for homebound older persons who need long term care because of health and social problems.

"Many older persons can continue living in their own homes even after they develop health problems with some help," said DHR Secretary Dr. Grady Stumbo while announcing the plan last week in Frankfort. "We have committed these funds to help those who cannot be cared for in the home for more of Kentucky's older people."

Agencies in 12 area development districts have been asked to develop a coalition and present a proposal for providing home care to the elderly to the Department's Division for Aging Services. The proposals must include

wherever services and a plan for allowing older persons to pay for the services when they can afford it.
