Students lack comprehension
 A recent study by the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) suggested that most American students are lacking basic reading skills, but not how to adequately analyze or evaluate what they read. NAEP noted that reading enjoyment decreased with age. At age nine, 81 percent liked to read, but this enjoyment shrank to 50 percent at age 13 and 46 percent at age 17. All age groups preferred watching television or going to a movie over reading.
 The study recommended less emphasis on school upon multiple choice examinations, which generally require a simple recall, and more emphasis upon essay examinations requiring synthesis of information.

Milk referendum results are given

Unofficial results of the milk referendum conducted by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture show that Grade A milk producers have voted to increase their current sale and manufacturing grade producers have voted not to increase theirs, according to Agriculture Commissioner Allen W. Barkley 11.
 Grade A producers were voting on whether to increase their net aside from eight cents per hundredweight to one percent of the gross producer pay price at 3.3 percent butlerfat.
 Manufacturing grade producers were voting on whether to increase their net aside from three cents per hundredweight to one half of one percent of the gross producer pay price at 3.3 percent butlerfat.
 Barkley said that he was announcing the preliminary results because so many people have shown an interest in the referendum.
 The American Dairy Association of Kentucky used the net aside as part of a promotional and educational program designed to increase consumption of milk and dairy products.
 Under Kentucky statutes, the Kentucky Department of Agriculture is mandated to conduct milk referendums to insure impartiality.
