# Bowles found guilty in District Court last week

Nicholas County Jailor Lynn Bowles was found guilty of public intoxication by Judge G.A. Parramore in Nicholas County District Court last Wednesday. Bowles had been arrested and charged with public intoxication after he was driving on Elm Street. He retained attorney Doug Miller and pled not guilty to the charge. As a result of the conviction last week, Bowles was given a \$25 fine and assessed court costs of \$25.00. According to arresting officers in the incident, Sgt. Finch of the Nicholas County Police Department, and Constable Ronald McDonald, the Nov. 8 car crash owned by Mrs. Sheila Fisher. The impact of the collision knocked Fisher's car into her visiting sister's car. The post-arrest complaint filed on Bowles said that he was picked up after Finch and McDonald noted that he was "drunk on his feet" and that he had "slurred speech."

McDonald said following the arrest that Bowles was charged with public intoxication rather than driving while intoxicated because he was already out of the car when local law enforcement officials arrived on the scene.

McDonald said that a drunken driving charge would have been thrown out of court since he had not actually seen Bowles behind the wheel, "even though we know he had been driving the car."

Sgt. Finch said that Fisher's car was totaled in the accident and that damage to the Bowles vehicle was estimated at under \$100. The third car received only minor damage.

After Bowles' arrest last month, he was taken to the Nicholas County Jail and turned over to the custody of the Deputy Jailor. The Deputy Jailor is his wife.
