While you are waiting to fix the Christmas dinner, relax and think about a garnish or two, to give a really festive look to the meal. We will not get into anything fancy at this stage, but a finishing touch here and there: garnishing food may sound frivolous, but a few of the niceties of life ARE important and they can give a glamorous look to a simple dish, making it more appetizing.

I guess the first thing we think of in the way of a garnish is parsley. Make sure it is crisp and fresh by putting the sprigs in ice water for several hours, then drain and refrigerate them in plastic bags. Use the sprigs as you please. Don't forget snipped parsley over a mound of mashed potatoes on a platter, separated by sprigs of parsley and topped with melted butter and a sprinkling of ground nuts.

You can give breads and other baked goods a glamorous touch with decorative cherries, nuts and candied fruits. Slices of orange, lemon or lime make fresh appetizing garnishes for wassail, salads and drinks.
