U.S. John Ecton said that the project would involve 82 poles and 600 feet of cable. Ecton raised the possibility that the court could cheaply purchase old railroad ties from TTI. He said that he could drive the ties into the ground with a loader. Judge Smoot was to check on the possibility.

Agreed to pay the premiums on a \$10,000 performance bond for Blue Grass Medical Services. The annual premiums will cost \$20. The bond will be obtained through Charles Cox.

Learned from Judge Smoot that County Treasurer Lanny Hutchison would remain in his post through the end of the fiscal year for an increase in salary to \$250 a month. Hutchison had asked for \$300 a month and threatened to resign if he didn't get it. He had been receiving \$125 a month.

Was questioned by Clerk Scott as to whether Magistrate were to be paid if they did not attend meetings. Magistrate Bus Atkinson told Scott that the court was only required by law to meet twice a year.

Discussed a personnel problem at the county farm involving employee Hugh Treadway. While no official action was made, Road Superintendent John Ecton was given authority to dismiss Treadway if the situation cannot be resolved.
