On Jan. 12, 1867, the first issue of the Carlisle Mercury went to press in the Masonic Building, a three-story edifice on the present site of the City Square.

The infant publication, so history and tradition say, had a "rather precarious footing" for he war had just closed and money was far from being plentiful.

The mechanical equipment, so far as can be learned, consisted of a Washington hand press, the "pulling" of which on press day became the ambition of every school boy.

The paper issued the first year was seven columns wide and consisted of four pages, all of which were printed at home. Then there were no "paid insiders" to be had.

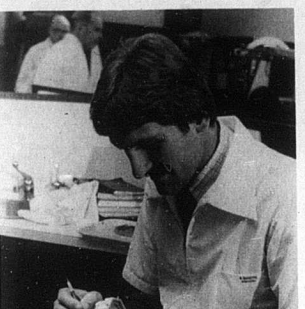
