Car owners must have liability coverage

Your automobile insurance policy is a contract providing protection against specified types of financial loss. It spells out your rights and insurance company and those of your insurance company.

Under the previous system, you were required to prove the other driver was at fault, and you were free from fault, before you could recover your losses from the driver's insurance company.

Under the Kentucky no-fault law, passed in 1975, you are required to carry a minimum amount of basic liability protection for injuries and property damage.

Persons injured in traffic accidents who are entitled to no-fault benefits receive immediate payment of their out-of-pocket losses up to \$10,000.

Persons who reject no-fault insurance protection will be required to pay the cost of their own liability insurance.

Administration hopes to balance budget without additional tax
State Finance Secretary George Atkins has told a legislative committee that the Brown Administration will submit a balanced budget to the 1982 General Assembly - without new taxes.

Atkins said agencies were being asked to prepare budgets for the next biennium that would spend to the effects of inflation. He said, the would amount to cutting departmental budgets by the General Division of Consumer Price Index rises in the next biennium.

State public school system reorganized

State Superintendent of Public Instruction Raymond Barber has announced a reorganization of Kentucky's public school system at the state level.

Under the plan, the former Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will no longer exist as an agency within the Kentucky Department of Education. Barber said this move will streamline operations without reducing programs or services.

Barber also announced that the office of fiscal control has been abolished. Divisions formerly under this office will move under the Bureau of Administration and Finance to be headed by Arnold Guess, former director for the State Building Authority.

Other changes under the reorganization include abolishing the position of special projects coordinator in the former occupational department and the elementary and secondary department in the office of federal and state liaison services will also be abolished.

With impending budget cuts at the federal level, it is important that the state return to a professor to the University of Louisville this fall.
